### **Cambridge business GlobalSign makes donation to local children's chorus**

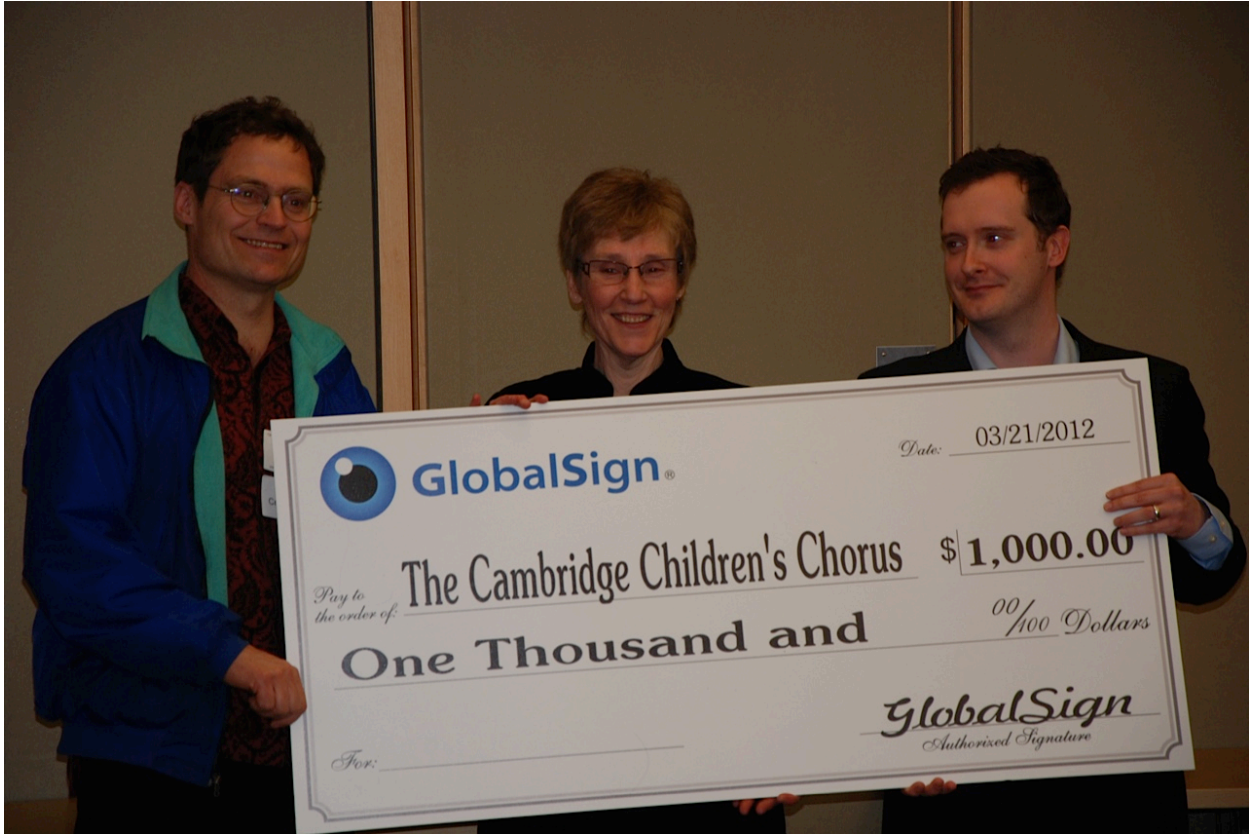

The Cambridge Children's Chorus began in 2012 and has over 60 singers from Cambridge, Somerville, Arlington, and surrounding areas. The singers represent 16 local schools, including Peabody, King Open, Haggerty, Baldwin, Amigos, and St Peter's. The chorus offers two programs, the Kodaly Singing Class for children ages 4-6 and the Training Chorus for ages 6-11. Due to the generous support from organizations such as GlobalSign, the Cambridge Children's Chorus ensures that no child is ever turned away due to lack of funds.

In January, the singers gave an inspiring debut performance and also sang at the Many Helping Hands 365 MLK Day of Service in Cambridge. They will continue to share their gift of song at two upcoming concerts this spring: the Four Choir Concert in April and the Cambridge Spring Concert in May.
